Other Suggestions

- A multi-use framework for advanced decision support handling several use cases [from the survey]
- Bi-directional patient communication (certification of allergies, meds, goals and priorities), correct record entries, restrict access for specific team members
- Net negotiated price transparency across the health care system
- Data access for VBC
- Interoperability uses of Admission, Discharge and Transfer files
- Interoperability of medical devices
- Free, real-time, patient data access to their medical information immediately following care

ISP Task Force Charge

- Overarching Charge: To make recommendations on priority uses of health information technology and the associated standards and implementation specifications that support such uses.
- **Specific Charge**: The ISP Task Force will:
 - 1. Make recommendations on the following:
 - Priority uses of health IT (consistent with the Cures Act's identified priorities);
 - The standards and implementation specifications that best support or may need to be developed for each identified priority; and
 - Subsequent steps for industry and government action.
 - 2. Publish a report summarizing its findings.
